Covid-19 guidelines at International People's College - Autumn Term 2020

Prior to arrival Students	 If possible, students will have a test done in their home countries 2 - 4 days prior to their arrival on campus. A negative test will most likely help when entering the country. If the student has not been tested in his/her home country it is strongly recommended that he/she is tested on arrival in the testing facility at Copenhagen Airport. Following EU regulations, the use of a face mask is mandatory at CPH airport. If from the airport the student takes public transport (train or other) it is strongly recommended that the student keep the mask on until arrival to IPC IPC will provide a letter to students & immigration authorities explaining that we have now been allowed to run our school and welcoming students Precondition for being allowed as a student is that the student has no symptoms that potentially could be Covid-19 related. Students belonging to a well-defined risk group will identify themselves upon arrival (2 meters social distance will be mandatory) If a student or staff member has been in contact with a contaminated person e.g. in the near family, he/she will be tested and will self-isolate for 7 days after the test have been taken 	IPC will obtain a letter from the Danish police acknowledging a folk high school stay as a justified reason for re-entering the country. Travelling to Denmark and Helsingør is potentially risky. A number of travel recommendations will be listed to avoid contamination (protection masks, gloves, strict observance of social distancing, etc.)

Prior to arrival Hygiene at IPC	 Prior to the arrival of students, single or double rooms will be made available for all. Rooms and common facilities will be professionally cleaned/disinfected. Fresh & clean linen, duvets and pillows will be provided Doors to common areas will be permanently open to avoid touching of handles. Upon arrival Students	 Students will arrive and go directly to the designated reception area (it will be set up outdoors if the weather allows or in Lecture Hall) Arriving students will fill in the questionnaire attached to this document before receiving the keys to their rooms Students will be tested within the first week of the course. Students will be able to freely move in common areas (indoors & outdoors) as long as they keep a 1 meter distance (from all sides) to each other and all IPC staff. In relation to students and IPC staff belonging to a risk group the social distance will always be 2 meters. No alcohol will be allowed until Friday 21st of August from 7 pm. After this date drinking alcohol in a responsible way will be allowed mainly Friday and Saturday nights. 	toilets/bathrooms. An info-session on Covid-19, contamination risk, precautions, hygiene, etc. will be held for all students together with a thorough presentation of this strategy. Information about precautions and hygiene will be repeated on a weekly basis in different forms and will be summarized and visible in Common Room Info Screen

Daily operations Classes and activities

- IPC will make sure that each student has a minimum of 1 meter around her/him in classes and during all organized activities run in IPC premises. In case of students belonging to a risk group the space around him/her will be 2 meters.
- Tables, chairs, classroom equipment etc. will be disinfected by students and teacher once the lesson is over
- Teachers area in classrooms Teachers will have a
 defined "student-free" area in each classroom. The
 distance between the teacher's area and the first row
 of students will be 2 meters distance.
- There will be a 10 minutes break in the middle of each lesson. During that break windows and doors of the classroom will be opened for ventilation
- All staff members will stay at a distance of min. 1 meter from students. In case of staff belonging to a risk group, the social distance will be 2 meters.
- Only 1 student at a time will be allowed to be in the reception area of Manor House.
- Interaction between different groups of staff members will be limited.

Cleaning & hygien	е

- Cleaning will be done more often and more carefully
- A professional company will clean all common areas on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday. Monday and Thursday the cleaning will be done by Contact groups.
- Toilets and bathrooms need to be cleaned every day. This is a responsibility of the students.
- Rooms need to be ventilated twice a day (10 minutes each time)
- Teachers will be responsible for the cleaning of the facilities that they use a lot including toilets.
- Public toilets will be locked up and only be available for staff members. Some specific toilets will be only available for a specific group of staff members
- Students will only use their own toilets and bathrooms
- Toilet seats and sinks must be cleaned after every use.
- Switches, handles and common surfaces in bedrooms & units will be cleaned by students everyday
- Dustbins in common areas will be emptied once a day
- Sports equipment, arts & crafts tools, musical instruments and keyboards and mouse (computer room) will be disinfected after every use by the users.

Public toilets and users:

- Toilet with facility will be only used by Kitchen staff
- Guest toilet in entrance A will be only used by teachers
- Lecture Hall toilet with electronic key will be only used by teachers
- The other toilet in LH will be closed and not used.

Health issues
(students)

- Students who experience symptoms of illness will self-isolate immediately.
- If symptoms increase or continue for more than 2-3 days,
 IPC will arrange for a visit to the doctor.
- Self-isolation will continue 48 hours after being symptom-free.
- If a case of Covid-19 is suspected or identified the student will move to one of the isolation rooms to live in isolation. Meals will be brought to the unit at mealtimes served on disposable tableware
- If it is confirmed by a test that a student is infected, all his family group will be tested and will go in selfisolation for 7 days after the test have been taken.
- Contaminated students will remain in isolation 2 days after being free of symptoms.
- If a student has been in contact with a contaminated person, he/she will be tested and will self-isolate for 7 days after the test have been taken.

Isolation rooms: room 60 and Meditation room

If needed, the school will take care of the transportation of the student to medical center or hospital under safe circumstances wearing protection mask and ensuring maximum ventilation.

The contaminated person will be in contact with the school via phone or social media.

In case of aggravation of the student's condition the contact teacher and all staff will be notified for further action.

Note: government guidelines say that if a student has symptoms, the priority is that the student goes back home in self-isolate there. If going back home is not possible the self-isolation will take place at the school

Health issues (staff

- In relation to the working conditions of staff belonging to a risk group or living with a family member that belongs to one of the risk groups:
 - Students will be officially informed about staff members belonging to a risk group.
 - 2 meters distance will be always respected by students and colleagues.
 - Teachers area will be marked with tape in every classroom.
 - Further measures will be taken in specific cases upon request from the staff member.

The use of face masks is recommended for staff belonging to a risk group in situations or moments where to keep the 2 meters distance will be difficult. IPC will provide the masks (IIR type) for the staff that request them.
